## **BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVES**

Endorsed by WHO<sup>1</sup>, PCC has gained widespread recognition and acceptance in healthcare<sup>2</sup>. To foster a PCC approach, educators are responsible for creating environments that prioritise the development of communication skills and empathetic relationships in a creative, meaningful way.

Globalised learning has transcended traditional classroom boundaries, providing innovative opportunities for students to connect, collaborate, and learn<sup>3</sup>. While, peer learning promotes active engagement and participation which enhances students' comprehension and retention of content<sup>4</sup>.

The Ida Institute, founded in 2007, with the purpose of promoting PCC in audiology, utilised a multinational peer learning opportunity in the form of a virtual conference to engage students across the globe on PCC in October 2022.

### The objectives of the study were to: (i) assess students' comprehension of PCC elements before and after engaging in the virtual conference, (ii) evaluate the efficacy of the opportunity

## **LEARNING OPPORTUNITY**


The online conference was hosted by the Ida Institute across 7 sessions over 2 hours with students and faculty joining from six academic insititutions.



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# Insights from a multi-national virtual peer learning student initiative on Person-Centered Care (PCC)

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A mixed-method approach, including an e-survey with (i) retrospective pre-post, closed-ended and

(ii) open-ended questions was used.

104 students with a mean age of 21.5 (0.07 SD) completed the survey.

Majority were female (93%) and from Global North regions (83.7%).



Three main themes emerged from the open-ended questions: i) application of PCC; ii) perspectives of PCC; and Fig 2. Main themes and sub-themes that emerged from three open-ended questions iii) barriers to PCC; with nine sub-themes.





## METHOD AND RESULTS




Fig 1. Retrospective pre-post scores with level of significance Statistically significant (WSR, p< 0.001) improvement in knowledge was noted between pre-post ratings for all topics.

• This novel event allowed students to create and participate in the first multi-national PCC

conference, resulting in international links and support fostered across 3 continents.

• Presentations underscored the significance of addressing cultural humility, health literacy,

and the evolving role of audiology in comprehensive client well-being.

• The evaluation demonstrated significant advancements in PCC knowledge.
